THE EFFECTS ON PROPERTY TAX

It is estimated that the tax rate for bonds will increase \$0.64 per \$1,000 of net taxable value of a property. Starting in 2028 and thereafter, it is estimated the tax rate will drop back to 2022 levels. To make this more meaningful, examples of the tax effect are given below for selected property values.
